

Gordon Ade-Ojo is a Professor of Language and Literacy Policy in Lifelong Learning and Deputy Head in the School of Education at the University of Greenwich. Gordon's teaching interests include Language and Literacy development and, Language and Literacy Teacher Education programmes. He has worked in teaching and training for over 40 years, commencing his career in higher education teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) and other linguistics courses, later moving into curriculum and programme areas for a variety of further education colleges.

He joined the University of Greenwich to lead on the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) course, and the literacy specialism course on the Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) programme. He is currently the Deputy Head of the School of Education, the programme Director for Doctorate in Education Programmes, teaches literacy specialism courses on the PGCE FE programme, the MA Education programme, as well as supervises doctoral candidates.

Professor Ade-Ojo holds the Principal fellowship of the Higher Education Academy, is a Founding Fellow of the Chartered College of teaching and a Fellow of the Royal Society for the encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce (RSA). He holds memberships with the Education Committee of the Southwark Diocese and the Institute of Linguistics.
